The December Full Moon. Try to spot the Pleiades star cluster!

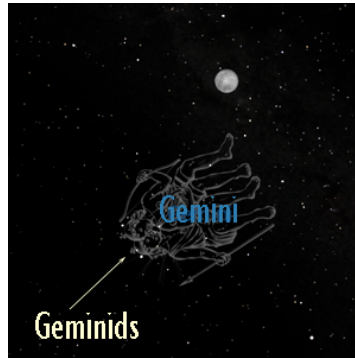

Saturn and Jupiter low over the southwestern horizon.

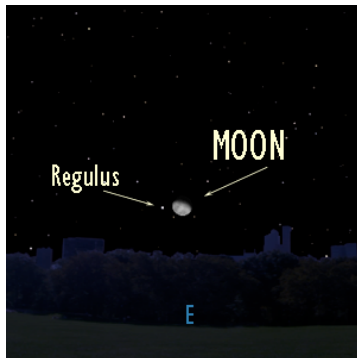

The bright star Regulus, in the constellation Leo, close to the Moon.

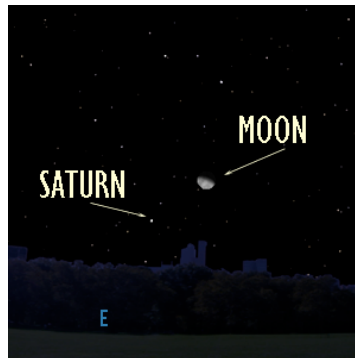

Saturn sits low on the eastern horizon close to the moon.

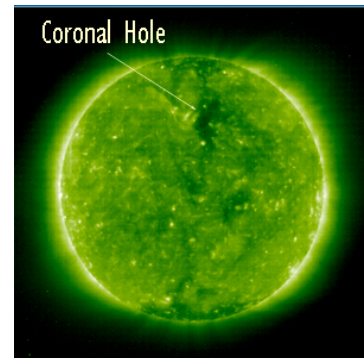
