

Summer Worlds Tour Terms and Conditions

Summer Worlds Tour is a peanut free camp.

Age Affirmation:

The Adler Planetarium, Field Museum, and Shedd Aquarium take great care to design age-appropriate camp curriculum each summer. Campers must fall within the designated age and grade ranges specified in the descriptions by the first day of camp. Summer Worlds Tour reserves the right to request a birth certificate to confirm a camper's age at any time before or during camp. If this does not match with the birth date information entered at the time of registration, placement in camp will be forfeited and no refunds will be made. This policy is to ensure that all campers have the best possible camp experience.

Cancellations and Refunds

For all camps: To receive a 90% refund, we must receive your cancellation 60 days or more prior to the start date of your camp session. If cancellation is received 15 to 59 days prior to start date you will receive a 50% refund. Within two weeks or less of the start date, no refund will be given for cancellations.

Waiver

Prior to the start of camp, you will be e-mailed a copy of a waiver and photo release. You must sign and bring that waiver on the first day of camp. No child will be admitted to camp without a signed waiver.

Allergies and EpiPens:

Summer Worlds Tour is concerned for the health and safety of all children participating in summer camp. All Summer Worlds Tour counselors are trained to recognize the signs of a severe allergic reaction and in the administration of EpiPens. Accordingly, when an enrolling child has a severe, life-threatening allergy, the following process is required:

Upon review of camp rosters, parents/guardians of children with severe allergies will be contacted and sent copies of Summer Worlds Tour's Authorization for Emergency Care of Children With Severe Allergies and Summer Worlds Tour's Release and Waiver of Liability for Administering Emergency Treatment to Children With Severe Allergies. Please note that all four steps outlined below are mandatory so that we may provide the best camp experience for all campers:

**SUMMER WORLD'S TOUR CAMP
POLICY FOR ADMINISTERING EMERGENCY TREATMENT
TO CHILDREN WITH SEVERE ALLERGIES**

The Summer World's Tour Camp ("Camp") is concerned for the health and safety of all children participating in the Camp. Accordingly, when an enrolling child has a severe, life-threatening allergy, the following process is required:

PARENT(S)/GUARDIAN(S) MUST COMPLETE AND/OR PROVIDE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

1. A signed copy of the Camp's Authorization for Emergency Care of Children With Severe Allergies ("Authorization Form"). The Authorization Form must be filled out completely by the child's parent(s)/guardian(s). The Authorization Form is designed to provide the Camp with the information necessary to ensure an effective response to a serious allergic reaction occurring at the Camp.
2. A signed copy of the Camp's Release and Waiver of Liability for Administering Emergency Treatment to Children With Severe Allergies ("Release"). The Release releases the Camp, its sponsoring entities and its and their employees from liability for administering, attempting to administer or failing to administer treatment to children with severe allergies (including the administration of Benadryl, epinephrine and/or any other medications) and taking any other necessary actions set forth in the Authorization Form.
3. All equipment and medications needed by the Camp to comply with the instructions set forth in the Authorization Form (including, but not limited to, a device such as the EpiPen. Jr.). The parent(s)/guardian(s) is/are responsible for ensuring that all medication is current and is properly labeled by a pharmacist. The parent(s)/guardian(s) is/are also responsible for providing a suitable receptacle (backpack/fanny pack) for the child to carry the medication each day the child is at Camp.
4. Prior to the child's first day of attendance, the parent(s)/guardian(s) or their designee(s) is responsible for training selected staff of the Camp on the nature of the child's allergy(ies), including (i) the events/substances that may trigger a severe allergic reaction (e.g., bee sting, consumption of peanuts or products containing peanuts, etc.), (ii) with respect to food allergies, limitations on the child's food consumption, (iii) symptoms of a severe allergic reaction, and (iv) when and how to administer treatment for a severe allergic reaction, including, where appropriate, the procedure for administering Benadryl or epinephrine through an EpiPen. Jr. or similar device.

No child with a severe, life-threatening allergy will be allowed to participate in the Camp if the above requirements are not met.

THE CAMP WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FOLLOWING:

1. The completed and signed Authorization Form and Release will be maintained in the Camp files, and copies thereof will be provided to and discussed with appropriate Camp staff.
2. In the event a child is provided emergency medical treatment for a severe allergic reaction, the instructions provided on the Authorization Form will be followed, 911 will be called immediately, Security staff will be notified of the camper's condition and location, and the child's parent or guardian will be contacted.
3. In the event a child is provided emergency medical treatment for a severe allergic reaction, the Camp staff member who provided emergency medical treatment will prepare an incident report as soon as practicably possible after the event to document the steps that were taken to administer treatment to the child, including the symptoms expressed, treatment/medications provided, timing of treatment, individual providing treatment, individuals contacted, etc. This report will be kept and maintained in the Camp files.
