Adler Planetarium Opens New Permanent Exhibition Chicago's Night Sky on Friday, Nov. 22

Nov. 5, 2019— As long as people have walked the Earth, they've looked to the sky as a creative muse, a constant companion, and a gateway to the mysteries of our Universe. This November, the Adler will open a brand-new exhibition to help connect you—and your city—to the wondrous human tradition of looking up. *Chicago's Night Sky* opens November 22.

This new 5,000 square foot exhibition will showcase the Adler's signature programs and initiatives like Far Horizons, Zooniverse, and Youth Organization for Lights Out. There will also be a new Community Star Studio house within the exhibition. One of four new Community Design Lab concepts, which will focus on connecting art to the night sky.

Exhibition Highlights:

- Discover how people from all over the world have imagined stories in the stars.
- See the Adler's world-renowned collection of celestial globes, star maps, and more.
- Take part in real research by identifying constellations in historic celestial maps from the Adler's collection.
- Create your own constellation. Together we can reveal a modern mythology of star stories.
- See how the Adler is working to measure light pollution and help find solutions to restore and protect dark skies.
- Discover how the Adler's Youth Organization for Lights Out program helps Chicago teens to experience dark skies.
- Experiment with aspects of lighting design to learn how to build better lighting.
- · Learn how to find interesting things to see in the night sky.
- See how works of art can take us on journeys across the sky.
- · Make your own art to visualize your connection to Chicago's night sky in the Community Star Studio.
- Experience the night sky over Chicago as it appeared in 1913, and take a live guided tour of the Atwood Sphere Chicago's oldest planetarium
