### PARENT TOOL KIT

### WHAT'S INSIDE YOUR BACKPACK

Help your camper pack their backpack with these items:

- Water bottle and sunscreen.
- Peanut and tree nut free lunch. For the safety of all participants, it is required that lunches are free of products containing peanuts or tree nuts.
- Extra snacks and drinks. Please pack a little extra in your camper's lunch for healthy snacking.

## Car Ride Home Questions

### Adler Planetarium

Have you ever looked up at the stars and wondered what (or who!) might be up there? Come explore the Universe's most extreme environments and even uncover some extreme life right here on Earth! At Adler, campers will discover what's needed to sustain life and compare Earth environments to those on other planets. They'll also see a show in one of our state-of-the art theaters and explore the Adler's exhibits.

- What is a tardigrade? What's exciting about them?
- What is an exoplanet? Would you want to travel to one?
- If you wanted to send a message to an alien civilization, what would it say? How would you send it?

### Field Museum

Today, Antarctica can be a forbidding land of snow and ice—but dinosaurs thrived there 200 million years ago in a lush, forested environment. Campers will explore the new exhibition *Antarctic Dinosaurs*, which follows Field Museum scientists on the thrilling search for never-before-seen fossils and sheds new light on our planet's changing climate and geology. Through hands-on exploration, campers will learn more about dinosaurs and pterosaurs, fossils, the fossil preparation process, and how the Earth has changed over the past 200 million years.

- What is a pterosaur? Is it a type of dinosaur? What can we know about pterosaurs from looking at their fossils?
- How do scientists find fossils? What do scientists do to prepare fossils for people to see in museums?
- How is Antarctica different from 200 million years ago? How do we know that it's changed so much?

### Shedd Aquarium

Watch sea jellies pulse, ribbon eels dance and a rainbow come alive in Shedd's new special exhibit, Underwater Beauty. Campers will discover how animals use color, pattern and rhythm to survive and thrive in the waters of the world. A secret world comes to life as we explore adaptations that are not usually visible to the human eye. Campers will meet animals up close, explore habitats, and put themselves into the "shoes" of an aquatic creature.

- How do animals use color to communicate with each other? What kinds of messages do they send?
- If you could have any kind of camouflage, what kind would you have and why?
- What are some words you would use to describe the different ways animals at the aquarium move?

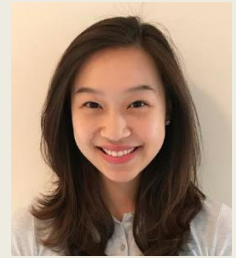

## Drop-Off Checklist: 8:30-9:00am

- ☐ Place parking placard (received the first day of camp) on dashboard when entering the queue. Park along curb and turn on hazard lights before exiting the car. This will give you 10 minutes of standing time.
- ☐ If you arrive after 9:00am, please drop off your very excited camper at their scheduled A.M. Museum.
- ☐ If someone other than you is picking up your camper, please let counselors know at drop-off time.

Note: In the event of inclement weather, you may be directed to drop-off/pick-up your camper at their am/pm museum. A message will be at (312) 322-0329 indicating if alternative drop-off/pick-up procedures are in use.

Drop-off and Pick-up will take place at The Field Museum Bus Drop-off on the east side of the building in between the parking lot at the East Entrance.

## Pick-Up Checklist: 3:00-3:30pm

- ☐ Please be aware that if you arrive later than 3:30pm, you will be charged a late pick-up fee of \$5.00 for every five minutes.
- ☐ Place parking placard (received the first day of camp) on dashboard when entering the queue. Park along curb and turn on hazard lights before exiting the car. This will give you 10 minutes of standing time.
- ☐ Sign out your camper using your initial on the check-out sheet.
